This cabin was constructed by volunteers and State Park staff for your use and enjoyment. Please help keep it neat and attractive for those who will use it after your visit.

Important Information:

- Let someone know where you are going and when you expect to return. Take a cell phone.
- Cabins may only be used by those who have paid the rental fee in advance, and only on the days specified on the receipt. You must have your receipt-permit with you during your stay.
- Cabins may not be used for commercial activities.
- The Division of Parks & Outdoor Recreation may close cabins due to weather, maintenance problems, break-up, ice conditions, or other reasons.
- Refer to the attached information: "Reservation Cancellation and Use Policies" for cancellation/credit policies and other important information.
- Call the State parks office for cabin and trail condition updates.

What to take to the Cabin:

- The cabin measures 12' X 14'. Two single and two double plywood platform beds can sleep at least 6 adults.
- The cabin is supplied with a wood stove, table, seats, broom, ax, saw, and shovel. All other camping equipment and supplies must be provided by the user, including:
 - Sleeping bag and pad or air mattress
 - Food
 - Cookware, dishes, utensils
 - Cooking stove and fuel
 - Matches, lighters, paper fire starter
 - 9-volt battery for smoke detectors
 - First aid items
 - Plastic trash bags
 - Jug of water
 - Saw or ax, just in case
 - Firewood
 - Flashlight
 - Lantern and fuel

Public Use Cabin

A few necessary do's and don'ts:

- Do not leave food or garbage in the cabin at the end of your visit. It might seem helpful to share food with future cabin users, but food (even in airtight containers) attracts bears and small animals. It doesn't take them long to seriously damage a cabin. Please pack out everything you packed in.
- Do not leave cookware, sleeping pads, or other items in the cabin at the end of your visit.
- Firewood is scarce around Fielding Lake so plan to bring some with you. Smaller (2"X6"X12") pieces work best. Please leave some cut wood for the next visitor. A box saw and ax are provided for your use. Only DOWN or dead trees may be cut. Firewood may not be removed from the premises or the recreation area.
- Keep the fire in the stove under control. Do not leave the dampers open when you are not in the cabin, as a fire could start and destroy the cabin. Close all dampers completely at the end of your visit. Stove instructions are posted on the wall.
- Please dispose of all waste water in the toilet. Water dumped outside the cabin is unsightly, unsanitary, and attracts unwanted wildlife. **Do not place garbage in the toilet,** please pack it out.
- Target practice is prohibited. Most of the recreation area is closed to hunting. See regulations for details.
- Stay alert and cautious of any trapping activity in the area. Traps and bait may be located near trails. Children and pets should be monitored closely.
- Please tie dog teams and horses at least 100' from the cabin. Do not tether animals to live trees. Use a cable or other anchor system which does not allow the animals to scar living vegetation.
- Feel free to write your comments in the cabin's logbook. Please report any missing or damaged furnishings or other problems to the State Parks office in Fairbanks immediately.

The Lock Combination is: _____

Fielding Lake Public Use Cabin

Access to Fielding Lake State Recreation Area is at Mile 200.5 on the Richardson Highway, 67 miles south of Delta Junction. Turn west on Fielding Lake Road and go 2 miles to the recreation area.

Trail Description: By mid-October the 2-mile road to Fielding Lake State Recreation Area is normally snowed-in and accessible only by snowmachine, skis, snowshoes, etc.
