

Request for Section 106 Review: 36 CFR 800

As part of the LWCF application, you must provide project information to the Office of History and Archaeology (OHA) to request a Section 106 Review and determine whether your project will affect cultural, historical or archaeological resources. Note that you are seeking the Review in conjunction with an LWCF grant application, and submit, at a minimum, the following to OHA. **Include OHA's written response or copy of your request awaiting response in your LWCF grant application package.**

Basic Information:

1. Contact Name, Address, Phone Number and E-mail
2. Project Name
3. Landowner
4. Project Address/Location
 - a. USGS Quad Map
 - b. Meridian: Township, Range, and Section
 - c. Latitude/Longitude

Project Undertaking: Include a detailed description of the project, a localized project map, and photos of the area. (Current, historic, and aerial photos are helpful.)

APE: Identify the Area of Potential Effects (APE) on the USGS map and localized map. The APE is the geographic area within which an undertaking may cause changes in the character or use of the property. Explain how the APE was developed and how it encompasses potential direct and indirect effects.

If cultural, historical, or archaeological resources are on the property, describe how this was determined, and seek further input from OHA.

Ground Disturbance: excavation, trenching, grading, tree removal, hydro axing, utility installation, new construction, access roads, borrow areas, staging/storage areas, etc.

If the project involves any ground disturbing activities, describe

1. Length, width and depth of proposed ground disturbance
2. Previous and current land use, condition, and disturbances

Dear Ms. Bittner:

The Alaska Department of Natural Resources – Division of Parks and Outdoor Recreation Design and Construction (ADNR-DPOR D&C) is proposing to improve Finger Lake State Recreation Site (SRS) (Sec. 34, T18N, R1E, S.M. USGS Quad Anchorage C-7). Pursuant to 36 CFR 800.4(d)(1), implementing regulations of Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act, the ADNR-DPOR D&C finds that no historic properties would be affected by the proposed project.

The project consists of expanding and landscaping the park entrance; installing a new park entrance sign, approximately three picnic shelters, a new toilet, and a hand carry launch and dock; developing an entrance station with an orientation kiosk, a camp host site for the campground, two campground loop roads with approximately 35 camp sites, day use parking area, and two group areas; replacing an existing toilet; reclaiming portions of the existing road; improve day use parking area; and convert portions of the existing road to trail. All improvements will occur within Finger Lake SRS.

The Area of Potential Effect (APE) includes the entire Finger Lake SRS. The Alaska Heritage Resources Survey (AHRs) was reviewed on April 15, 2010 for known cultural or historical resources that may be affected by the proposed project. No sites are located within the APE. AHRs site ANC-03050 is located on private property near Finger Lake SRS and is outside of the APE. There will be no impacts to AHRs site ANC-03050.

ADNR-DPOR D&C concludes improving Finger Lake SRS will not affect known historical sites and there will be “No Historic Properties Affected” by this project.
