




*Why be a member of the State Parks Advisory Board? Who are they? What are they responsible for? Where do I fit in?*

### Who?

The Ketchikan Area State Parks Advisory Board is a group of 9 Ketchikan area citizens diverse in age, professional backgrounds, and personal interests who come together monthly to advise the local Department of Natural Resources Division of Parks and Outdoor Recreation. The Advisory Board recommends and assists in planning related to state parks with the common goal of improving recreational opportunities and protecting our local state parks lands for the betterment of all citizens.



### What?

The Ketchikan District State Park boundaries cover park facilities and lands at: Totem Bight State Historic Park, Settlers Cove State Recreation Site, Refuge Cove State Recreation Site, Grindall Island Cabin and State Marine Park and marine parks on Black Sands Beach and Blank Islands, Grant Island, Joe Island, Betton Island and Dall Bay. Ketchikan District State Parks manages several trails, 4 picnic shelters, 2 public-use cabins and 13 campsites for recreational use.


### Where?
