

High Tunnel Tours and More...

Saturday, May 21st

- 3:30 –Optional: Meet at the Wagners’ to park and carpool and/or drop off potluck items.
- **4:00pm Featured High Tunnel #1: Eivin Kilcher and Eve Steller Matkin at Stellar Organics**
This high tunnel is a 30x72 from Farm Tek. They have an irrigation system up and running and 5.2 fabric covering. He will have some implements on display ranging from a broadfork to his tractor/tiller. One mile down Marimac out East End about 11 miles.
- **5:00pm Featured High Tunnel #2: Donna Rae Falkner and Iceman at Oceanside Farm**
This high tunnel is a tidy 24x28 from Oregon Spring. They have solid polycarbonate end walls and a double layer of inflatable plastic for the cover. On the bluff in town at 811 Ocean Dr Loop.
- **6:00pm Featured High Tunnel #3: Neil and Kyra Wagner’s at Turning Point Farm**
There are two tunnels here, one 20x24 and one 20x36, both from Farm Tek, covered in the woven 5.2 mil fabric. Located up Williams Place a couple miles out East End Rd.
- **Potluck /Presentation**: Joining us for these tours is [Jeff Smeenck](#), Cooperative Extension Specialist for Commercial Horticulture and Assistant Professor of Horticulture.
