2014 School Gardens

Currently there are 146 Schools out of 489 in the state using a garden or greenhouse with students to teach agriculture education.



Some fun facts:

- That represents 31% of the public K-12 schools in Alaska
- This is up 10% from 2012 for a total of 43 new gardens or greenhouses around the state!
- This represents 75% of the school districts around the state.

Project Ideas

Hold a special day or event that features a food producer or local chef and talk with students and faculty about local food.



Celebrate Alaska Agriculture Day by hosting a Farm-to-School activity or classroom lesson.
