Here are a few ideas from the Division of Agriculture on how to celebrate Agriculture Day:

- Look for, ask for, and buy Alaska Grown at local stores, farmers markets, and greenhouses. Buying local supports local farms and keeps your money in your community.
- Try planting certified Alaska seed potatoes this year. A growing number of stores are selling certified, locally-grown seed potatoes in a kaleidoscope of shapes and colors.
- Help educate children about local food by volunteering to assist with an agriculture-related school project, such as the "Carrot Seed Tape" activity which is available on our website under the Farm to School Program links.
