Division of Agriculture to host Farm to School Conference

(Palmer, AK) – The public is invited to attend Alaska's first-ever Farm to School Conference on Jan. 13 and 14 in Anchorage. The conference is designed to help schools and communities develop farm to school programs, which seek to have Alaska food products available in local schools.

The Division of Agriculture received a \$25,000 competitive grant from the U.S. Department of Agriculture Farm to School Program to host the conference. Deborah Kane, the national director of the USDA Farm to School Program, is scheduled to attend the Alaska conference.

The first day will emphasize Farm to School in the classroom and community, and the second day will focus on the cafeteria and local food producers.
