

PUBLIC NOTICE

The Alaska Plant Materials Center (AKPMC) has applied to the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation for a permit to apply pesticides in a coastal zone district.

The following project is proposed in your area and is being reviewed for consistency with the Alaska Coastal Management Program. Your comments, particularly on the proposed project's consistency with the affected local coastal district management program, are requested. To be considered, written comments must be submitted to the Alaska Department of Environmental Conservation, Pesticide Program at 1700 E. Bogard Road, Bldg. B, Ste. 103 Wasilla, AK 99654 and must be received on or before April 30, 2007. Comments regarding inconsistency with an affected coastal district's enforceable policy or a state standard set out in 6 AAC 80.040- 6 AAC 80.150 must identify the enforceable policy or standard and explain how the project is inconsistent.

PROJECT NAME: AKPMC's aerial pesticide applications for the control of broadleaf weeds
PROJECT SUMMARY AND LOCATION: This project is located at the Alaska Plant Materials Center near Palmer, Alaska. The treatment area consists of approximately 100 acres currently in agricultural production of grass and grain seed. The herbicides intended to be utilized include:

- Banvel EPA# 51036-289 active ingredient Dicamba
- Bronate Advanced EPA# 264-690 active ingredient Bromoxinil and MCPA
- Low Vol 4 EPA# 34704-124 active ingredient 2,4-D
- X-77 Spreader adjuvant

The application is expected to occur sometime between May 25 and June 10, 2007 depending on weather and weed growth.
