I was pleased to learn about your Federal Overreach Summit.

I am a Utah State Representative and chair the Federalism Committee of the American Legislative Exchange Council. I crafted the legislation which created the Utah Commission on Federalism. Attached please find an invitation letter from our Senate President and Speaker of the House to consider joining with Utah and other states as we explore how we begin acting together to restore the balance in what is supposed to be our unprecedented state-federal governing partnership.

In 2012, I also passed the Utah Transfer of Public Lands Act (HB148). Since that time, four other western states (ID, MT, NV, and WY) have passed similar legislation to initiate the process for the transfer of federally controlled lands in western states. The South Carolina Assembly also passed a resolution supporting the transfer of public lands to willing western states.

Also attached please find a Legal Analysis of the Utah Transfer of Public Lands Act commissioned by the Federalist Society, an organization of more than 40,000 constitutionally-focussed lawyers, scholars and professors.
