

NHPA AND ALLOTMENTS

- Conducted at the request of Tribes or BIA functions
 - Sales, ROW, Lease's, etc.
 - Inadvertent Discoveries.
 - Artifact Repositories
- Can link multiple properties into a single report if it's the same project.
- Can issue ARPA Permits to consultants for projects, and ARPA Permits can cover multiple properties per application.

PROPERTY ACTIONS

- The BIA has multiple layers for property actions, so if a project does require a ROW, Lease, or other form of action, contact as soon as possible.
- Acting on the NHPA or NEPA is also climate-dependent, if a request is made in the autumn, it likely won't be surveyed until after winter.
