



Historic Transportation Routes

Qualified RS2477 Rights-of-Way identified and included in the January 2001 Report to the Legislature

The Division of Land RS2477 staff researched the historical use and land ownership of these routes and found that they meet criteria for RS2477 rights-of-way: the original easements containing the historical documentation and land ownership research are located at the Department of Natural Resources, Division of Mining, Land and Water.

Note: This map does not show 1190 other routes researched by DNR, Division of Land, as part of the RS2477 Project. These include:

- 16 Rejected Routes (route does not meet criteria for an RS2477)
- 20 Pending Routes (researched, but more information needed)
- 124 R-O-W Routes (researched, found route already had right-of-way or closely parallels an existing r-o-w)
- 212 Duplicate Routes (route already in database under a different name)
- 451 Deferred Routes (route crosses early federal withdrawal and evidence of construction prior to withdrawal unlikely)
- 367 Hold Routes (historical information lacking or trail importance unclear)

- Geographic Place Names: Dictionary of Alaska Place Names (1967) and U.S. Geological Survey, The Alaska Maritime National Wildlife Refuge (NWR) is not completely depicted. Areas where it is depicted are shaded, however, they are not outlined. The Alaska Maritime NWR is described as follows:

The Alaska Maritime NWR consists of all public lands, including submerged waters and interests therein on islands, islets, rocks, reefs, spurs, and detached coves and headlands in the coastal area and adjacent seas of Alaska within five designated subunits: Chukchi Sea, Bering Sea, Aleutian Islands, Alaska Peninsula, and Gulf of Alaska Basin, and includes an undetermined quantity of submerged land, if any, retained in Federal ownership at the time of established coastal Kodiak and Afognak Islands. The refuge is generally depicted on the USGS maps entitled, "Alaska Maritime National Wildlife Refuge" dated October 1979.

Note: This map shows general land ownership information. When reviewing this map, please remember that federal, ANCSA, and state land ownership is depicted hierarchically by entire sections. For example, any portion of a section (640 acres) falling within State Patented or Tentatively Approved land covers the whole section to be depicted as state land, even if the State Patented or Tentatively Approved land is only a fraction of the section, and federal land under ANCSA land also occurs in the section.

The land ownership hierarchy is as follows:

1. State Municipal Entitlements or Land Exchanges or Other Land Disposals
2. Patented Disposed Federal Lands (Native Allotments or Private Parcels)
3. State Patented or Tentatively Approved or Other State Acquired Lands (includes case types 101-114, 116-117, 128-129)
4. Alaska Native Claims Settlement Act (ANCSA) Patented or Interim Conveyed
5. Major Military
6. National Wildlife Refuges, National Park System Units
7. National Wild & Scenic Rivers outside National Park System Units and National Wildlife Refuges
8. National Forests and Monuments, National Petroleum Reserve-Alaska, National Recreation Areas and National Conservation Areas
9. Bureau of Land Management Public Lands

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
