2022-2023 Kids Don't Float Poster Contest



Eligibility and Guidelines

- 1. Open to all Alaska elementary school students (kindergarten through sixth grade).
- 2. Poster entries should support the *Kids Don't Float* objectives of educating Alaskans about the importance of always wearing a life jacket when boating and the dangers of Alaska's cold water. Entrants are encouraged to use information from the Office of Boating Safety's website and publications.
- 3. Poster submissions become the property of the Alaska Office of Boating Safety.
- 4. Students may use any materials to construct their poster. Entries must be between $8 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 11" and 16" x 20". Creativity is encouraged!

Contest Rules and Dates

All posters must be physically or virtually turned in to the Alaska Office of Boating Safety by **April 15**, **2023**. Winners will be selected no later than April 21, 2023.

Entries should depict safe boating practices and must be original work. Lettering and images should be large and bold enough to reproduce digitally.

A label on the back of each entry must clearly list the student's name, grade level, school name, parent teacher's name, and parent or teacher's contact information. Omission of this information may disqualify an entry. Premade labels are available on our website. If submitting the poster virtually (by taking a photo of it and emailing it to officeofboatingsafety@alaska.gov), please include the above information in your email.

Winning Posters

Three winners (one K-2nd, one 3rd-4th, and one 5th-6th) will receive a new life jacket in their size. Many posters will be selected to be displayed at a local business in Anchorage during the month of May to promote safe boating. Submitted posters may be used by the Alaska Office of Boating Safety in presentations and on social media.
