Important Information:

- Let someone know where you are going and when you expect to return.
- Cabins may only be used by those who have paid the rental fee in advance, and only on the days specified on the receipt. You must have your receipt-permit with you during your stay.
- Cabins may not be used for commercial activities.
- The Division of Parks & Outdoor Recreation may close cabins due to weather, maintenance problems, break-up, ice conditions, or other reasons.
- Refer to the attached information: "Reservation Cancellation and Use Policies" for cancellation/credit policies and other important information.
- Call the State parks office for cabin and trail condition updates.
- The road into the recreation area is steep. During winter months, tire chains or 4 wheel-drive vehicles are recommended. The road might not be plowed until several days after a snow storm.
- There are 4 ice fishing huts on the lake, available for rent during the winter. Contact Alaska State Parks for information.

What to take to the Cabin:

- The cabin measures 20' X 24'. Two lower double plywood platform bunks and two single upper platform bunks that can sleep at least 6 adults.
- The cabin is supplied with a wood stove, table, seats, broom, ax, saw, and ash scoop. All other camping equipment and supplies must be provided by the user, including:
 - Sleeping bag and pad or air mattress
 - Food
 - Cookware, dishes, utensils
 - Cooking stove and fuel
 - Matches, lighters, paper fire starter
 - 9-volt battery for smoke detectors
 - First aid items
 - Plastic trash bags
 - Jug of water
 - Saw or ax, just in case
 - Firewood
 - Flashlight
 - Lantern and fuel

Public Use Cabin

A few necessary do's and don'ts:

- Do not leave food or garbage in the cabin at the end of your visit. It might seem helpful to share food with future cabin users, but food (even in airtight containers) attracts bears and small animals. It doesn't take them long to seriously damage a cabin. Please pack out everything you packed in.
- Do not leave cookware, sleeping pads, or other items in the cabin at the end of your visit.
- Please leave some cut dry wood for the next visitor. A bow saw and ax are provided for your use. Only DOWN trees may be cut. Firewood may not be removed from the premises or the recreation site.
- Keep the fire in the stove under control. Do not leave the dampers open when you are not in the cabin, as a fire could start and destroy the cabin. Close all dampers completely at the end of your visit. Stove instructions are posted on the wall.
- Please dispose of all waste water in the toilet. Water dumped outside the cabin is unsightly, unsanitary, and attracts unwanted wildlife. **Do not place garbage in the toilet,** please pack it out.
- Target practice is prohibited. Much of the recreation area is closed to the discharge of weapons. See regulations for details.
- Stay alert and cautious of any trapping activity in the area. Traps and bait may be located near trails. Children and pets should be monitored closely.
- Please tie dog teams and horses at least 100' from the cabin. Do not tether animals to live trees. Use a cable or other anchor system which does not allow the animals to scar living vegetation.
- Feel free to write your comments in the cabin's logbook. Please report any missing or damaged furnishings or other problems to the State Parks office in Fairbanks immediately.

Quartz Lake Ice Fishing Huts

The turnoff to Quartz Lake is located at Mile 277.8 Richardson Highway, approximately 14 miles northwest of Delta Junction. Follow the access road 3 miles to the huts on Quartz Lake.

The huts are brown with dark green trim, and the numbers (D8, D9, D10 or D11) are painted on the buildings.
