- A. Agency and Government Reports
 - a. State Parks –Park Superintendent Jack Blackwell
 - The state has adopted a new regulation packet (effective May 5th) that includes the Kenai River anchor buoy proposed by the KRSMA board.
 - The Bing's Landing boat launch is currently closed while the state replaces the boat ramp. The new ramp is slightly longer and keyed into the riverbed and will reopen by April 23.
 - All permanent seasonal staff have returned to work.

b. DEC – Sarah Apsens

- The 2021 Field Report for the DEC Kenai River Water Quality Monitoring Project is posted online here: https://dec.alaska.gov/water/water-quality/reports/. The report summarizes findings from year one of this project. We are currently preparing for the second year of sampling. Six sampling events are planned for 2022. The first event is scheduled for late April. A final report is planned for 2023.
