



Alaska Conservation Corps (ACC) Application

ALASKA STATE PARKS has seasonal jobs for Alaskans through the Alaska Conservation Corps. To qualify, **you must be an Alaska resident and at least 18 years old**. Tasks will vary and may include trail work, campground care, visitor contact, or office work. ACC workers receive up to \$20 per hour and work a 20 - 40 hour week. To apply, fill out the application and return it to the park office(s) of your choice (addresses listed on back). Most positions begin in late May or early June. Some offices will start recruitment as early as March. You may wish to call the office in the area you wish to work in, to find out what positions they are offering this year and when application are being accepted.
