Name information such as origin, meaning of the recommended name, historical significance, biographic data (if commemorative), nature of usage or application, or any other pertinent information:

Submitted via the U.S. Board on Geographic Names, the proposal is to officially name a 4710-foot summit in Chugach State Park Mount Elliott. The proposal provides strong evidence for local usage, shows the feature is not in a Wilderness Area, and meets the five year provision for Commemorative Names. The Commemorative name honors Sergeant Robert "Bob" T. Elliott Jr., a military paramedic serving in the 71st Air Rescue Squadron and 5040th Operations Squadron at Elmendorf Air Force Base, Anchorage, Alaska. In May 1960, Elliott died, along with pilot William A. Stevenson, attempting to assist three mountaineers needing evacuation from Denali (then Mt. McKinley) when the Cessna 180 piloted by Stevenson crashed at 17,200 feet. The mountain peak has been referred to as Mount Elliott by the community and publications since the 1970s. This proposal is commemorative in nature, based on the contributions of Robert Elliott to Alaska.

This proposal was tabled by the Alaska Historic Commission on June 7, 2022 to allow the proposer to gather more biographical information on Robert Elliott and his significance to this peak. The commission members also recommended that the proposer resubmit the proposal under "local use" rather than under the commemorative category. The proposer was contacted again in August 2023 for more information on the proposal. In their response, the proposer emphasized the established local use of this name for over 60 years by Mountaineering Club of Alaska members and hikers. They also noted that while there was probably a Dena'ina name for the summit, but that name is currently unknown and has not been rediscovered, making it "overwhelmingly likely that 'Mount Elliott' is the oldest and only name for this feature to exist in living memory."

Is there local opposition to, or conflict with the recommended name (as located)?

While the Mountaineering Club of Alaska's Geographic Names Committee recognizes that the name Mount Elliott has appeared on numerous commercial maps and periodicals dating to its use in an article in 1966, they also note that a variant spelling of the name is Mount Elliot. That said, a guiding policy of the MCA's Geographic Names Committee is not to endorse proposals to name geographic features after people, whether living or dead. Therefore, the MCA's Geographic Names Committee does not approve the proposal for this longstanding name (via the MCA in Spring 2022).

For proposed new name, please provide evidence that feature is unnamed: Mountain is unnamed in USGS Map Viewer. Search of GNIS shows no other Mount Elliott present in the State of Alaska.
