Proposer recommends a name for this currently unnamed rock formation "Mocha Spire" as it rises from so-called "Coffee Glacier" near the proposed "Coffee Spire." The Mountaineering Club of Alaska states that, "there are two high quality technical rock climbing routes on this formation. It will be visited numerous times by climbers from around the world in the future. It is very important that it have a name that can be referenced in photographs, videos, written trip reports, stories and accounts of future route development."

The Club's proposed name is descriptive since the rock formation rises out of "Coffee Glacier," which is the local name for an unnamed glacier east of Ruth Glacier. It is also a brown color that matches the color of Mocha. They also state that the proposed name has been used by local, American, and international climbers, as well as the *American Alpine Journal*, NPS rangers, and commercial glacial pilots in the area for an estimated 12 years.
