

2019 Alaska Historic Properties Specialist Workshop for Oil Spill Response

The U.S. Department of the Interior (National Park Service and Office of Environmental Policy and Compliance) and the Alaska Office of History and Archaeology are coordinating a workshop for **Historic Properties Specialists (HPS)**, the cultural resource personnel activated to advise on-scene coordinators on historic properties protection during oil spill and hazardous materials responses as called for in the national *Programmatic Agreement on Protection of Historic Properties During Emergency Response Under the National Oil and Hazardous Substances Pollution Contingency Plan*. This 3-day workshop is currently being developed and is tailored to emergency response in Alaska.

When: The workshop is being offered two times in 2019 on October 29-31 and November 5-7 (8:30 AM Tuesday through 4:30 PM Thursday).

Additional workshops may be planned in the future if there is funding and demand.

Where: Both workshops will be held in Anchorage at the National Park Service Alaska Regional Office, 240 W 5th Avenue.

Applications are due by August 23, 2019. Please send completed application forms and any questions to oha.permits@alaska.gov. Attendees will be notified of their acceptance by September 9, 2019.

Up to forty (40) participants for each workshop will be chosen from the pool of applications. Priority is given to:

- Cultural Resource Management (CRM) professionals who meet the Secretary of the Interior's Standards and have Alaskan CRM experience
- Personnel from federal and state land managing/regulatory agencies
- Cultural resource professionals representing Alaska Native tribes and organizations or local governments

Prerequisites: 1) Incident Command System (ICS) Training 100 and 200 level courses and 2) Resource Advisor (READ) Course – Basic, which are available free online at:
