Permit Application:

The Permit Applicant determines which State Land Agencies administer land to be surveyed, and lists them by MTRS and Agency

- Some State Land Managers require a land use permit from them before they will sign SCRIP's
- 2. State Land Managers (MHT and UA) have been declining access for archaeological surveys
- 3. Issues of trespass have arisen because applicant was not aware of land boundaries and ownership
- 4. Declining OHA Staff
- OHA will post guidance online for using the Alaska Mapper state land ownership system, and will assist with unclear land ownership issues

- Permit Application:
- Old language on permit form: "New permits may be withheld pending the receipt of delinquent reports."
- New language in Stipulations: "SCRIP eligibility is contingent upon the satisfactory completion of prior SCRIPs. Applicants are not eligible for further SCRIPs until the requirements of SCRIPs from previous field seasons are satisfied."
- This does <u>not</u> include surveys that were permitted for one season but the survey was delayed until the next season.

Permit Application:

Monitoring now requires a SCRIP.

Permit Fieldwork:

OHA expects subsurface testing and screening in areas that may contain prehistoric and historic subsurface resources.

If the Field Supervisor determines subsurface testing is not warranted, the survey report will provide an explanation and images (i.e., landforms and ground surfaces) showing why subsurface testing was not appropriate.

■ Permit Fieldwork:

Standard survey documentation will not be held confidential.

4. Land use Stipulations from DNR

Old text on permit form:

"Camps, including all gear and equipment, must be relocated a minimum of 2 miles at least every 14 days. Sites must be left in clean, safe condition. All trash, food and litter should be removed from the site and disposed of properly. Establishment and use of any camp requiring occupancy for more than 14 consecutive days requires authorization of the Division of Mining, Land and Water, and may require a permit from the Division of Environmental Conservation."

The change here is DNR plans on enforcing it.

- 5. Special Permitting Stipulations
- 1. This section will be blank on most permits.
- For very large or sensitive projects, this is where OHA
 may stipulate that an OHA employee be included on
 the survey crew.
