Updated Guidance for Inadvertent Discoveries



Sarah Meitl, M.A., will lead a presentation about how to handle inadvertent or unanticipated discoveries in Alaska. She will highlight updated *Inadvertent Discoveries Guidance* from the Office of History and Archaeology and will walk through answers to common questions received by the office. Discussion will sort through how land ownership can change the process, the differences between state and federal law, and when law enforcement may need to be involved.

The presentation will provide step-by-step guidance for inadvertent discoveries, including how the process will vary if human remains are involved. This workshop is geared towards CRM professionals, project managers and engineers, land managers, agency partners, and Tribes.
