

NOTICE OF PROPOSED CHANGES IN THE
REGULATIONS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES

The Department of Natural Resources proposes to adopt regulation changes in Title 11 of the Alaska Administrative Code, dealing with the Recorder's Office, including the following:

- (1) 11 AAC 06.040(g) is proposed to be changed to expand the persons authorized to submit documents electronically for recording.

You may comment on the proposed regulation change, including the potential costs to private persons of complying with the proposed change, by submitting written comments to the State Recorder's Office, Support Services Division, Department of Natural Resources at 550 West 7th Avenue, Suite 1210, Attn: Vicky Backus, State Recorder, Anchorage, Alaska 99501, or by fax to (907) 269-8912 Attn.
