Nurseries in Alaska are locations where quantities of plants may be imported and held temporarily in a small area then disseminated across a wider area as the plants are purchased and taken home by customers and planted in the landscape. This creates an opportunity for plant pests that are not known to occur in Alaska to be introduced, spread and established.

This survey aimed to provide early detection of important plant pests, identify pathways for future introductions of exotic pests, reach out to nursery owners and employees about exotic pests and establish contacts so that they may be more likely to report pests they find in the future, and update the Alaska Nursery and Stock Dealer Database.

The Alaska Nursery and Stock Dealer Database for the Fairbanks, Anchorage and Matanuska-Susitna areas was updated in March - May. Overall, the number of nurseries decreased from the original list to the updated list. Many nurseries were no longer in business. It is difficult to determine if a new nursery has established in Alaska because Alaska does not have any requirements for nurseries to register with the Division of Agriculture or any other state entity.

The Nursery Survey was performed June 30 - July 9 by Jacquelyn Schade of the Alaska Division of Agriculture and Yolanda Inguanzo of USDA APHIS. During each nursery visit, we spoke to a manager or assistant manager about the Nursery Survey, pests of concerns, and potential vectors for pest entry into Alaska. We also asked them to fill out a questionnaire regarding the Alaska Nursery Industry. Only a few nurseries chose to participate in the questionnaire. Many managers were willing to share their insight and issues they have had in their nurseries. During the visual inspection at the nurseries, very little was detected. This could be because management culled out the plants that had pests or because it was towards the end of the nursery season in Alaska and most of the stock had already been purchased.
