Mineral Estate

The state retains ownership to all oil, gas, coal, ore, minerals, fissionable materials, geothermal resources, and fossils that may be in or upon the land that it sells (AS 38.05.125). The state reserves the right to enter onto the land to explore for and develop these mineral resources. The state may lease them to mineral developers or allow mining locations to be staked. However, Alaska law also provides that the surface owner will be compensated for damages resulted from mineral exploration and development (AS 38.05.130).
