THE RECREATION RIVERS PLANNING PROCESS

Below are major steps in the planning process with approximate timeframes for each step. Small amendments to the plan may be done in a shorter period of time, but since this plan has not been revised for 30 years, the timeframes provided are for a moderate revision to the plan.

- 1. Issues are identified through public scoping comment period and meetings to learn about interests and problems in the planning area. (30 days)
- 2. Updated information is collected on natural resources, present land and water use, land ownership, public use, and important public use sites. (60 days)
- 3. Management Alternatives and Agency Review Draft are prepared. (60 days)
- 4. Agency Review Draft reviewed by the Recreation Rivers planning team and advisory board. (30 days)
- 5. Public Review Draft is prepared and reviewed by the public. (60 days)
- 6. Final Plan is prepared. (30 days but dependent on the amount of changes)
- 7. Plan is Adopted by the Commissioner (20-day reconsideration period)
- 8. Legislature Reviews Plan. (100 days)
- 9. Implementation. The revised plan guides land management decisions in the Recreation Rivers corridors.
