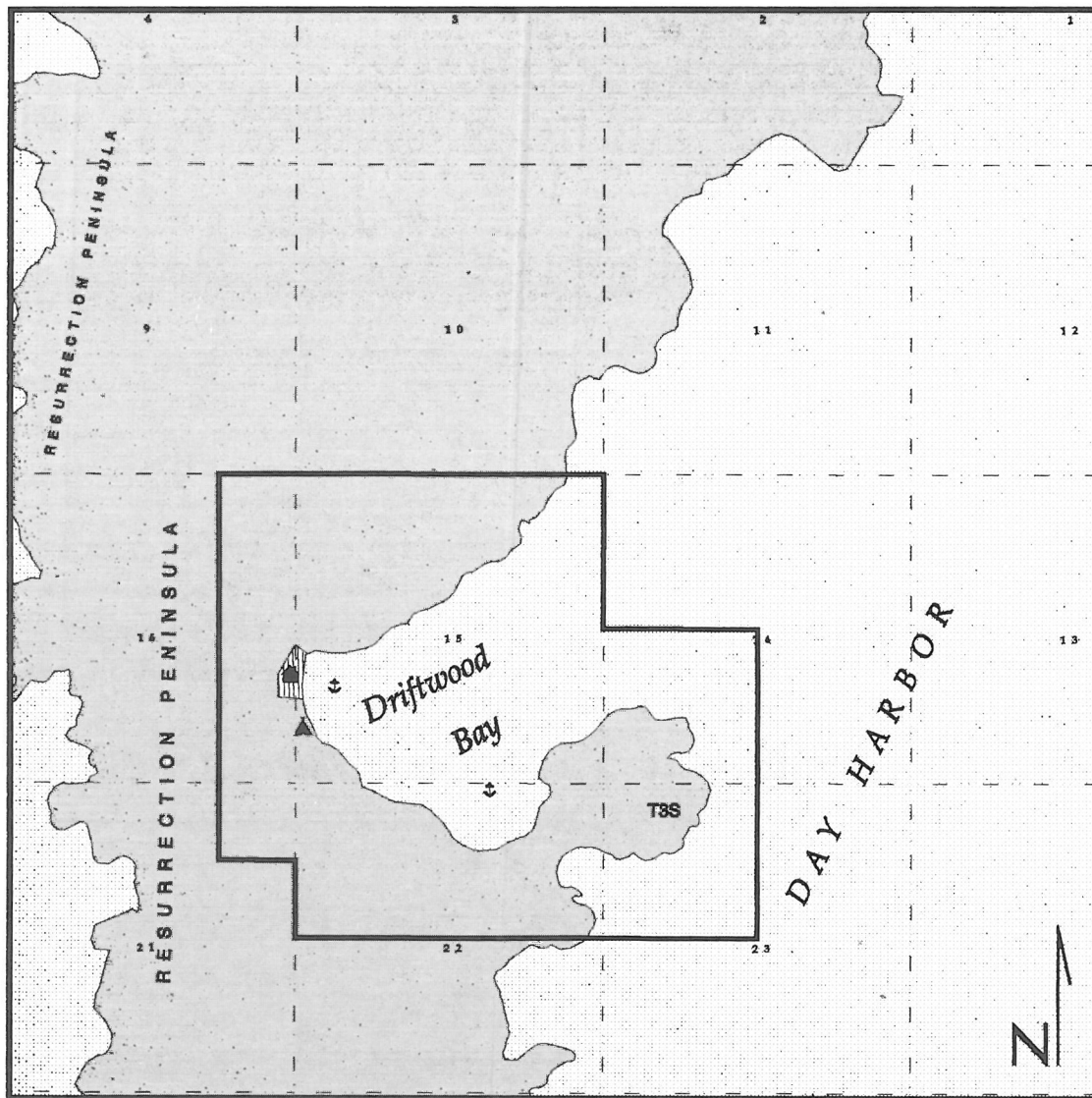

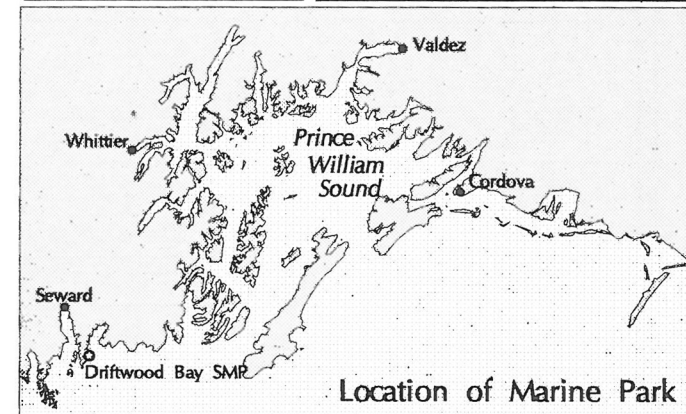

Driftwood Bay State Marine Park

Driftwood Bay State Marine Park is located 22 miles from Seward by boat. It is the southern most bay on the western side of Day Harbor. High rock cliffs surround the bay. The bay offers some protection from the Gulf generated ocean swells.
