New guidance on acoustical panel ceilings.

The <u>National Park Service has issued new guidance</u> that provides information about evaluating the significance of **historic acoustical panel ceilings** and on retaining them as part of residential and hotel conversion projects when they are character-defining features, taking into account feasibility, practicality, and other issues.

# **NPS Grant opportunities:**

The Notice of Funding Opportunities (NOFO) for NPS FY2024 competitive programs will be spring through fall 2024. To be notified when this year's opportunities become available, go to Grants.gov and subscribe to a saved search: for CFDA 15.929 for Save America's Treasures (SAT), 15.932 for Historically Black Colleges and Universities (HBCU), and 15.966 for all other competitive programs. You can create a saved search on grants.gov under the "Connect" menu. The application period is 60-90 days from the time the NOFO is posted on Grants.gov. Because the window to apply for funding is limited, we encourage all applicants to plan well ahead of the application deadline. Information on applying to all of NPS' competitive programs is available through their website year-round. Registration in Grants.gov, SAM.gov, and other federal systems can take up to four weeks, so start early. Extensions will not be granted due to incomplete registrations in these systems or applications.

## **Advisory Council on Historic Preservation news**

Chair Sara C. Bronin today announced the installation of three new ACHP members: Expert Member Erica Avrami; Tribal Member Amelia Marchand; and General Public Member Jane Woodfin. President Joe Biden appointed them to terms ending June 2028.

## **Program Comments: Housing and Climate Change**

The ACHP is considering the issuance of program comments based on two policy statements enacted in 2023 and seeks preliminary input from federal agencies, State and Tribal Historic Preservation Officers, Indian Tribes, Native Hawaiian organizations, preservation stakeholders, and the public on their potential scope. In both the <u>Policy Statement on Housing and Historic Preservation</u> and the <u>Policy Statement on Climate Change and Historic Preservation</u> the ACHP suggested the Section 106 review process could be improved to enable federal agencies to more effectively advance historic preservation while also meeting the nation's housing needs and climate goals.

A program comment is one of five types of program alternatives available in the Section 106 regulations to tailor approaches to how the requirements of Section 106 are achieved. A program comment allows the ACHP to comment on certain categories of undertakings in lieu of commenting on a case-by-case basis. Program comments can help federal agencies more efficiently handle repetitive actions across large inventories and on a nationwide basis, and they can provide clarity for the specific treatment of undertakings.

## **National Phasing Programmatic Agreement (Phasing NPA)**

Annual Report, Monitoring Report, & Proposed Amendment

The Phasing NPA, executed on December 6, 2021, requires the Forest Service to develop an annual report with information about the use of the Phasing NPA. ## Monitoring Period Report

The Phasing NPA established a 2-year monitoring provision, whereby the Forest Service invited comments on the effectiveness of the Phasing NPA and informational materials that have been developed to assist in its implementation through December 6, 2023. The second and last monitoring report is <a href="here">here</a> and also available on the Phasing NPA webpage <a href="here">here</a>.

## **Proposed Amendment Forthcoming**

Following the result of the Phasing NPA's first monitoring period in 2022, the Forest Service proposed three areas for minor technical amendments on the following topics: 1) Allow activities at 36 CFR § 220.6(d) to qualify for use of the Phasing NPA as long as such activities have a corresponding project or case file and decision memo developed under the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA); 2) Allow Forest Service to accept non-written communications from HIP consulting parties who respond to HIP invitations to consult; and 3)

Clarify the Tribal Signatory process to identify which Agency Official may accept a Tribal Signatory page. The Forest Service is gathering signatures to the amendment from Phasing NPA Signatories.
